

Break through

There are only a handful of places to study an MA in Broadcast Journalism and choosing City – situated in the heart of the media capital – was an absolute no-brainer. I graduated in the height of the pandemic when recent graduates were being called to the front lines. I was thrown in the deep end, which in hindsight was an opportunity of a lifetime. A home away from home



Using non-invasive optical sensors to monitor brain injury **Professor** Panicos Kyriacou



"The sensor is placed on the forehead and we shine light into the brain through the skull. The light bounces around, but some light is reflected back. We harness the light coming back - at different wavelengths - and then we apply machine learning models to tell us how that light is affected by hemodynamic changes and intracranial pressure in the brain."

"If you want to survive in a political world, you need numbers. My work helped produce some of the very first measures on how large and important the cultural economy is for the UK. Europe and internationally. In this country, we have seen that the cultural economy is now worth more than what politicians thought. In fact, for the past 20 years it has been growing faster than the rest of the economy."

Evidencing practice changes on the birthplace Dr Christine McCourt "Our research focuses on supporting evidence-based changes in healthcare. emphasising personalised, midwife-led care settings. In 1970, a government report advocated hospital births for all women. Professor Alison Macfarlane's analysis raised questions, leading to a campaign for more choice and personal care. The Birthplace Programme, involving our Research Centre, found midwifery units to be safe, cost-effective, and offering positive birth experiences with fewer interventions. This influenced NICE guidelines, recommending midwifery unit care for lowrisk women and encouraging home births for those with a history of normal deliveries.'



Postgraduate research degrees

Research is a vital part of City. In the most recent Research Excellence Framework (2021), 86 per cent of City's submitted research was considered world-leading (4*) or internationally excellent (3*) and City is now ranked 39th out of 129 universities in the UK for its research power*. Each research student is offered the opportunity to work closely with an academic in a stimulating environment that is designed to support their learning and development.

School of Communication & Creativity





The School of Communication & Creativity is an innovative and cutting-edge research environment. In the recent Research Excellence Framework (REF2021), 89 per cent of the School's submitted research was rated as 3* (internationally excellent) and 4* (world-leading).

The School has internationally acclaimed experts who are held in esteem by, and work with, UNCTAD, UNESCO, WIPO, the Department for Culture, Media and Sport, the British Council and the EU.

Our Department of Performing Arts research strengths include ethnomusicology; the interface between music and technology; various relationships between music scholarship and performance; and music analysis. While its reach is international, City's central London base attracts sizeable audiences for its extensive series of concerts, conferences and symposia.

The research strengths of the Department of Journalism include gender and diversity issues in journalism; international journalism including humanitarian news and coverage of conflicts; journalism policy, practice and ethics including digital media ethics; and new and emerging journalism. The Department enjoys considerable strength in partnerships through its close connections with diverse industry bodies and through its collaborations across City.

The Department of Media, Culture and Creative Industries is committed to research that will make a positive difference in the world, pushing forward knowledge and/or practice in the creative and cultural industries through research, public engagement and impact activities, and by promoting research-led, non-traditional curricula. It has research-led academic provision, which deliberately decolonises and re-envisions the curriculum.

Research degreesMPhil/PhD



Duration

Full-time: up to four years Part-time: up to seven years

The School offers supervision for research degrees across its core disciplines:

- Culture and creative industries (creative economy, arts and cultural management, and creative cities)
- English (literature, creative writing, publishing and popular culture; global, transnational, noncanonical and marginalised Anglophone literatures)
- Journalism (business and leadership, digital practice, ethics, history, law and regulation, representation and democratisation, new and emerging journalism)
- Media and communications (international communications and news institutions in the global age; gender, media and development; transnational media and globalisation)
- Music (ethnomusicology, musicology, composition and technology).

Commencing with an MPhil, students transfer onto the PhD pathway following one year of satisfactory academic progress. Students might be required to complete specialist taught modules during the MPhil year.

The School of Policy & Global Affairs is a vibrant multidisciplinary environment. In the recent Research Excellence Framework (REF2021) 86 per cent of the School's submitted research was rated as 3* (internationally excellent) and 4* (world-leading).

We have strong links with our practitioner networks. We provide advice and guidance to the Home Office, the UN, the OECD and briefings to UK Government Ministers, the Ministry of Defence, the Foreign and Commonwealth Office, the Department for International Development and the European Parliament among others.

Students have the opportunity to join active research networks and clusters such as the School of Advanced Studies, the Institute for Historical Research, European Social Survey, the Centre for Competition and Regulatory Policy, the City Political Economy Research Centre and the Centre for City Criminology.

The Department of Sociology and Criminology is ranked first in London for the proportion of world-leading research (REF2021). It is home to the European Social Survey headquarters, a unique research centre with an international reputation for coordinating Europe's most important cross-national survey.

The Department of International Politics is ranked eighth in the UK for the proportion of world-leading and internationally-excellent outputs. Its areas of strength are in the fields of International Political Economy, Foreign Policy Studies, Comparative Politics, and International Social Justice. Its new specialisms are in Comparative and Modern History.

The Department of Economics is a leading centre for economic research in the UK with 85 per cent of its research and 92 per cent of its research outputs rated as world-leading (4*) and internationally excellent (3*) in REF2021. Research activities are broadly structured around applied economics, economic theory and behavioural economics, macroeconomics and finance.

Duration

Full-time: up to four years Part-time: up to seven years

The School offers supervision for research degrees across its core disciplines:

- Economics (applied microeconomics, macro-economics, health, behavioural economics, economic theory, finance)
- International politics (international political economy, foreign policy and diplomacy, international security, international social justice, comparative politics, modern history and quantitative political economy)
- Sociology and criminology (employment, crime and victimology, gender, youth studies and violence and society).

Commencing with an MPhil, students transfer onto the PhD pathway following one year of satisfactory academic progress. Students might be required to complete specialist taught modules during the MPhil year.

Bayes Business School (formerly Cass)

School of Health & Psychological Sciences



Bayes Business School is renowned for its impactful, world-class research that is as relevant to business and industry as it is to academia.

Academic staff apply their international perspective and industry experience to develop progressive thinking and explore imaginative new research angles on subjects ranging from marketing to investment, leadership to innovation. Each student is allocated two or more dedicated supervisors who will guide their research and foster their development as academic researchers.

Together, they form a vibrant and wellintegrated intellectual community with common collaborations and exchanges across different fields. This community regularly gathers in seminar series, where welldeveloped and less-developed work is presented and discussed in a constructive and friendly atmosphere. Two PhD courses are offered: the full-time PhD and the part-time Executive PhD.

The full-time PhD offers specialisations in the fields of finance, accounting, actuarial science, management, marketing and operational management. Throughout the course, students benefit from comprehensive research training including intensive courses in the core topics of their discipline, advanced courses and development workshops, and training designed to prepare them for the academic workplace.

The Executive PhD is designed to be flexible and enable busy executives to undertake a PhD without having to take a career break. It is for senior executives working in industry. government or not-for-profit sectors who want a qualification that combines academic rigour and practical relevance.

Executive PhD

PhD



Duration

Part-time: four years

The Executive PhD programme inspires professionals to develop new perspectives and approach change through rigorous empirical research. It offers all of the academic rigour of a traditional PhD, but is tailored to mid-career professionals, and aimed at those who want a qualification that is highly practical and relevant to organisations and industry.

The Executive PhD is a four-year, parttime degree programme, culminating in a dissertation that passes formal examination. Students receive theoretical and methodological training during six 40-hour residential weeks, and conduct independent research guided by faculty supervisors.

Our mission is to train students to produce valuable, practical research, closely related to real-world practice within our Faculties of Management, Finance and Actuarial Science.

Career opportunities

The course supports the career development of high-profile, research orientated business professionals who use research to enhance their understanding of the organisations and processes they manage.

It is aimed at individuals who are at critical points in their careers and supports them to change direction or secure more senior positions.

PhD MPhil/PhD



Duration

Full-time: four years

The course is designed for students who want to conduct their research in a world-class business school and an intellectually stimulating environment.

In year one, students attend a PhD-level education programme assessed by coursework, examinations and a thesis.

When they have completed the first year of their education and successfully passed the transfer panel at the end of their second year, students are registered for a PhD.

During years three and four, students deepen their research, finish research articles and present them at workshops and conferences. Every student is expected to submit a thesis and attend a viva voce (oral examination).

Career opportunities

A common route into academic research is a postdoctoral research post or fellowship after completing the doctorate. While some PhD recipients go on to permanent academic positions, others pursue a career in industry research.

The School of Health & Psychological Sciences is committed to enhancing health and wellbeing by partnering with healthcare users and practitioners, and delivering research that is innovative, usable and policy-relevant.

The School is looking for researchers to join a dynamic and stimulating research environment and build on the vibrant research culture in eight areas: maternal and child health, applied vision, health services research, language and communication science, mental health, healthcare innovation, psychology and food policy.

The School's research centres offer a very supportive and well-resourced environment for individuals wishing to pursue a postgraduate research degree (both MPhil and PhD). Students benefit from individualised supervision, participate in regular seminars, and can take up a suite of development activities based on their training needs. These might include patient and public involvement and engagement, research methods, methods of analysis and interpretation, and dissemination strategies. They may also choose to gain experience in teaching.

Academic staff and students benefit from recent multi-million-pound investment in new facilities including bespoke laboratories, public-facing clinics and simulation suites. Additionally, the School is uniquely placed to offer PhD students access to University of London research facilities, including its own extensive clinical networks.

Examples of PhD research include: public health nutrition advocacy in the UK; patients' quality of life with glaucoma: risk perception regarding pregnancy and childbirth: patients' reconstructive memories of critical care and nurses' understanding and response to these; addressing health inequalities in disadvantaged groups using health psychology theory and evidence: neurodevelopment and risk factors in schizophrenia.

Research degrees MPhil/PhD



Duration

Full-time: three years Part-time: six years

There are three routes to an MPhil/ PhD degree within the School:

- Major Thesis: students undertake a significant piece of original research and write a thesis based on that research.
- Thesis incorporating Prospective Publications: students undertake a significant piece of original research and prepare articles for publication in peer-reviewed academic journals as they proceed through their period of study. In the thesis, the published articles may be embedded within chapters which also contain the critical analysis, or they may be interspersed among chapters written in traditional thesis style.
- · Prior Publication: students who have published a significant body of articles in peer-reviewed academic journals spend between one and two years writing an extended treatise which draws this research together with analysis of previously published work by others into the context of a single overarching thesis.



The City Law School





The City Law School has a dynamic community of scholars and students with considerable strengths in education and research.

The School's research expertise straddles different areas and approaches, including doctrinal legal, socio-legal and interdisciplinary research. Our research strengths are diverse and range from EU, shipping, international and intellectual property law to commercial, human rights, competition and constitutional law.

We have several established research centres and groups, particularly in EU law, law and social change, international law, and criminal justice and human rights. Emerging groups include intellectual property, health law and bioethics, and the study of the legal profession.

The School is committed to academic excellence and our PhD students are fully part of our scholarly community both as part of the research groups, and through their own PhD seminar programme and support network.

Research degreesMPhil/PhD



Duration

Full-time: minimum period of registration is two years; maximum is four years

Part-time: minimum period of registration is three years; maximum is seven years

PhD students are assigned two supervisors to support them throughout their research. They also benefit from the School's Research Training Programme which focuses on research skills and methodologies, employability skills, career management and personal development.

PhD students become part of a stimulating research environment by participating in the activities of the School's research centres, institutes and groups.

The award of a PhD requires the submission of a thesis for examination at a *viva voce* (oral examination) by two examiners, at least one of whom is external to City. The thesis must be an original and substantial piece of work which makes a contribution to the relevant literature. All students are initially registered for an MPhil degree. Those students who wish to proceed to a PhD must upgrade within 18 months (30 months for part-time students).

The School of Science & Technology has a vibrant research community with an interdisciplinary perspective and a broad understanding of the impact of Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) on society.




All doctoral students are initially registered as MPhil students, except when they have transferred from another institution and have provided suitable and appropriate evidence that permits direct registration as a PhD student.

Creative Writing and Publishing MA



Duration

Full-time: one year Part-time: two years

Based in the heart of commercial and literary London, City has a distinguished track record in helping students to publication. This course welcomes students working in fiction, genre fiction and creative non-fiction and is designed to develop their creative writing skills through a variety of taught classes, workshops and supervisions. As well as core and elective modules, students take the Creative Writing Workshop and Special Studies modules, in which they share their work-in-progress with their fellow students, and analyse and learn from contemporary literary fiction, genre fiction or creative non-fiction texts.

Students also benefit from individual supervision across the year with our experienced lecturers, who are all successful published authors, and work towards their final submission of a 15,000-word piece of creative writing in the genre of their choice.



Career opportunities

The course helps students to develop a practical understanding of the different elements and genres of creative writing today. It also equips them with a range of transferable subject-specific and employability skills. In addition to publishing their creative work, graduates go on to employment in fields such as journalism, publishing and literary agencies, digital media, cultural organisations, charities and teaching. The course provides a thorough grounding in the drivers of commercial success for print and digital media, with a focus on digital content and e-delivery. Full-time: ten months

This keystone broadcasting course is highly rated by employers and has an exceptional national and international reputation. Students benefit from a diverse cohort of over 60 students, with access to an unparalleled network of alumni across the broadcast industry. The focus is on multimedia production, preparing students for a first job in radio, television, mobile, social, and digital journalism. On news days, students work in groups of 20, covering news, sport, and current affairs. The final project is a short documentary for television or radio, made individually or in pairs; these have won many awards including RTS and BITC Best Documentary Awards. This course is accredited by the Broadcast Journalism Training Council.

This exciting and contemporary course continues to develop in response to the rapidly changing environment of digital journalism in the UK and internationally, with a focus on social media, multimedia storytelling and data journalism. Video and audio work are also geared to online platforms.

Duration

Full-time: one year

The course was started in 1982 and has built a worldwide reputation with well over 1,000 alumni working all over the world. Students become adept at broadcast, print and online journalism in a global context. They study international news and obtain a profound understanding of international journalism from a UK and global perspective.

A pioneering course that is intense, challenging and designed to equip students with the reporting and research skills needed to produce investigations that matter. Basic reporting leads quickly to working with data, OSINT (open source intelligence), public records and information gained from using access to information laws.

Case studies of high-profile investigations help students understand how to investigate companies, organisations and individuals for issues of public concern, miscarriages of justice or abuse of power, ethically and legally. Students will work individually and in small groups to produce high-quality text, audio and film. Students will complete several complex and ambitious investigative projects under the guidance of experienced professionals.

Graduates move into employment across print, online and broadcast media. 





The course focuses on formal training in research methods for evidencebased practice and on applied data analysis, including quantitative and qualitative research and statistical analysis. There is a focus on managing the care of adults with particular attention to the needs of an ageing population. Students learn to practise autonomously and demonstrate professional integrity by working within recognised professional, ethical and legal frameworks.

Adult nurses are able to work in partnership with service users, their carers and families to support and promote health and wellbeing using excellent communication skills in order to develop therapeutic and compassionate relationships and promote person-centred care.

An intensive course suited to students who are committed to a career in speech and language therapy and who have already completed an undergraduate degree. This is a combined course, where on successful completion students are eligible to register with the Nursing and Midwifery Council as a registered nurse in the mental health and adult field of nursing. Students graduate with the skills and knowledge needed to equip them to support the delivery of quality healthcare in a contemporary health service.

Mental illness has a huge impact on the physical health of an individual. People with mental health conditions are at a higher risk of experiencing physical health problems, such as diabetes and heart disease. In addition, people with long-term physical health conditions are more likely to suffer from mental health issues, particularly depression.

Behavioural Economics applies psychological insights to human behaviour to investigate how people make economic decisions under various conditions of constraint (e.g., time and knowledge) and influence (e.g., social pressure). This is an important field in modern economics and the social sciences more generally.

Commercial organisations have long known the limitations of individual decision-making and they routinely use this knowledge in their commercial practices (e.g., the anchoring effect of minimum payment on credit cards). The real-world implications of behavioural economics are varied and significant and acknowledged to provide a powerful and cost-effective approach to improving human welfare.

The course is taught by psychologists and economists offering students a good foundation in both disciplines.



Career opportunities

Behavioural economists use data to better understand human behaviour. These highly valuable skills can be applied in a range of professions, for example to formulate policies or to analyse consumer behaviour. There is increasing demand for behavioural economists across different sectors, including financial trading and risk assessment, consumer psychology and marketing, consulting and public policy. The research focus of the course also allows graduates to proceed to PhD level research in economics or psychology.



Students have opportunities to develop a range of organisational consulting skills, such as managing client relationships, facilitating participative decisionmaking, negotiating access into organisations, facilitating employee focus groups and providing feedback.

The course covers the five knowledge areas for occupational psychology as outlined by the British Psychological Society. It is delivered by a dedicated team of research-active and chartered occupational psychologists.



Career opportunities

The course has high levels of employability with many students securing roles within the field or with public and private sector organisations including the Department for Business, Energy & Industrial Strategy, HSBC, KPMG and the Ministry of Defence, large and small occupational/business psychology consultancies and human resources departments. Full-time: one year

The programme is for non-law graduates wishing to engage in a career as barristers or solicitors. Unique to The City Law School, part of the Foundations of Law module is an introduction to legal ethics, to the values that characterise the profession and the ethical challenges lawyers might face in practice.

The programme comprises the seven core foundation subjects normally covered within a qualifying law degree and which are prerequisites for taking the professional training course for the Bar. They are also the basis of the knowledge needed for those intending to become solicitors. You have the option to convert to an LLB degree by taking further law modules.

The senior status law course is a rigorous and competitive programme and allows non-law graduates to receive an LLB law degree in just two years.

Students have the opportunity to gain skills and knowledge in core legal subjects and specialist areas of law.

In year one, candidates study four of the seven core foundation subjects usually covered in an undergraduate law degree. In year two, students take the remaining three core subjects and have the opportunity to enhance their knowledge of particular areas of law by choosing six elective modules.

The course attracts international students from around the world, Canada in particular. Canadian law-specific electives can be chosen in year two.

There are opportunities for students to develop legal skills in mooting, legal research and legal writing, and to take part in various probono projects.

Bar Vocational Studies (BVS) PGDip/PGDip with Specialism/LLM



Duration

Full-time: one year Part-time: two years

The course offers the choice of three different routes depending on whether students simply wish to qualify as a barrister or whether they wish to further enhance their employability and develop specialist knowledge and skills.

The course is available as full-time or part-time study. Students who choose to study part-time will have classes on two days per week, over two years, allowing them to work alongside their studies.

The Postgraduate Diploma with Specialism, which includes two additional modules in a specialist area of professional practice, allows students to further develop a critical understanding of the law, procedure and real-world insights in the context of that area.

Students also have the option of obtaining an LLM by completing a practice-focused dissertation or clinical legal education module (which includes undertaking supervised clinical legal work)* in addition to the compulsory vocational qualification for the Bar and the specialist modules. This route aims to enhance students' knowledge of substantive law and/or legal skills in relation to a particular area of professional practice and offers the opportunity for extended practical experience.

*The clinical legal education module is only available to full-time students.

Solicitors' Practice Programme (SPP) PGDip/LLM



Duration

Full-time: nine months (PGDip), one year (LLM)

The Solicitors' Practice Programme is designed for those preparing for the Solicitors Qualifying Examination (SQE), the new route to qualifying as a solicitor in England and Wales.

Over two 10-week terms, students will study material that will help prepare them to pass SQE1 and SQE2. Students may exit at this stage with a Postgraduate Diploma.

The Master of Laws (LLM) pathway provides an additional 5-week elective term and submission of a legal practice research project to deepen students' understanding of an area of legal practice that is of particular interest.

Students will build on their existing legal knowledge and will acquire the knowledge and skills required both for the SQE assessments and for practising as a solicitor.

The Future Solicitors Careers Advice Services (FSCAS) provides dedicated advice to help our students to secure the workplace experience they will need in order to qualify as a solicitor.

Students can also participate in the School's pro bono activities and work with real clients.

Full-time: 12 months (15 months with internship)

This professional, research-oriented, specialised course trains students in cutting-edge, nature-inspired artificial intelligence (AI), providing them with skills sought after by industry, government, and academia.

Students learn to design and apply advanced AI methods and techniques. The emphasis is on 'deep learning', neural networks and their applications to cognitive modelling, image classification and analysis, sequence prediction (e.g. natural language and video processing), reinforcement learning and creativity. Students explore the challenges of achieving explainable AI and how to address ethical and legal issues for responsible AI.

Learning is hands-on in a new, worldclass Al laboratory with the latest computers, tools, technologies, and the computational power needed for deep learning.

The course is led by recognised experts renowned for applying Al and machine learning to real-life problems and science.

Full-time: 12 months (15 months with internship) Part-time: 28 months

The course is designed for graduates of computing-related degrees who want to further specialise their undergraduate education and develop their careers in the games industry. Duration

Part-time: 28 months (with three months end point assessment)

Apprentices develop specialist skills in data acquisition, information extraction, aggregation and representation, data analysis. knowledge extraction and explanation. which are in high demand in many fields. The apprenticeship combines taught material and on-the-job training. The next generation of scientific discovery and innovation will be data-driven as previously unrecognised patterns are discovered by analysing massive and mixed data sets. Leadership skills developed within the programme include the ability to oversee and manage complex data science projects, including assessing project feasibility and risk analysis.

The course meets the requirements of the Digital and Technology Solutions Specialist (Integrated Degree) Data Analytics Specialist apprenticeship programme.

Engineering with Sustainable Technologies MSc

Duration

Full-time: one year

Students develop the knowledge, skills and values needed for a career in the growing aerospace industry, with a particular emphasis on multidisciplinary aerospace technologies aimed at reducing environmental impact.

City is one of the few universities in the UK that offers a combination of green aerospace technologies and advanced manufacturing that is focused on the requirements, challenges and possible solutions of technologies that promote sustainability in aviation.

Students will study both theory and practice related to the analysis, design, and evaluation of aerospace engineering systems and the underlying technologies, with the option to specialise in the field of automation and autonomy in aircraft and ground systems by taking on a specifically designed module.

Biomedical Engineering with Data AnalyticsMSc



Duration

Full-time: one year

This course offers insights into biomedical technology, focusing on delivering coherent training in the main design steps of diagnostic and therapeutic devices, from biology through technology to meaningful data.

It is directed towards graduates and professionals with an engineering background who want to obtain a significant understanding of the biomedical engineering field.

The course is uniquely interdisciplinary. It covers the signal aspect of biological functions and the design of biomedical instrumentation and sensors coupled with data analytics for processing, analysing and securely storing medical data, with elements of ethics and big data management.

Full-time: one year Part-time: either two or three years

Full-time: one year Part-time: two years

Duration

Maritime Operations and Management MSc



Duration

Full-time: one year with the project taking approximately three months during this period

Part-time: two to three years with the project taking approximately six months within this period

The course is designed to train professionals for the maritime and sea transport industries. It is open to graduates who have qualified in an appropriate discipline and to those serving at sea, offshore or inland-based organisations.

The course focuses on maritime operations, management, law and technology and the related business environment, with an emphasis on port security and risk management, marine environmental and offshore studies, marketing and selected aspects of conceptual ship design.

The course hosts prestigious visiting speakers and is accredited by the Institute of Chartered Shipbrokers. Successful students can apply for exemption from certain examinations of the Institute. It is also accredited by the Institute of Marine Engineering, Science and Technology and can lead to students becoming a Chartered Marine Technologist.





Maritime Safety and Security ManagementMSc



Duration

Full-time: one year with the project taking approximately three months during this period

Part-time: two to three years with the project taking approximately six months within this period

Safety and security are important aspects of the maritime industries. These include protection and regulation, incident investigation and management, piracy, cybersecurity, risk and uncertainty, resilience, human factors and leadership and management.

The course is directed towards professionals from the merchant marines, navies and those in land-based maritime occupations. Students should have a good grounding in their respective academic discipline or considerable work-based experience.

While focusing principally on maritime and offshore issues, there is an emphasis on the related fields of port security and the preservation of the marine environment. Students also benefit from prestigious visiting speakers from industry to talk on specialist topics. Additionally, the course takes advantage of the importance of London as an international maritime hub.



Career opportunities

The course is multidisciplinary and is designed to develop safety and security experts who are technically literate and understand risk and uncertainty analysis of maritime safety issues, design effective practices and contribute insights from applied research. It is focused towards management and leadership careers in marine safety management in the marine and offshore sectors and policy or regulatory organisations.

Project Management, Finance and Risk MSc



Duration

Full-time: one year Part-time: two years

The course provides students with a foundation in quantitative risk assessment and decision-making coupled with classical engineering economics and financial engineering.

Students unravel complex problems by applying scientific methods to real-world examples and discover how to measure risk on any scale.

From analysing indecision within game theory to rebuilding a country's infrastructure, students explore the drivers in which businesses operate and the challenges and opportunities that project managers face.

Combining expertise from City academic staff and visiting lecturers from industry, the course merges diverse and unique skill sets to solve complex problems.

The course is suited to students with a scientific or financial engineering background as the focus is on quantitative risk assessment, which requires an aptitude for problem-solving.

Graduates are prepared for a wide range of career opportunities involving project management, risk management and financial planning. It is well suited to those pursuing a career managing complex projects, applying the latest management tools and techniques.

Renewable Energy and Power Systems Management MSc



Duration

Full-time: one year Part-time: two years

The course, suitable for both practising engineers and those considering a career in engineering, has been designed to provide an in-depth insight into the technical workings, management and economics of the electrical power industry.

Due to the introduction of tough environmental laws, the use and integration of renewable energy schemes are now of paramount importance for nations to meet strict low-pollution targets. Knowledge of the impact of such schemes on the existing electrical grid structure is covered in great detail. In addition, modules covering power electronics, smart grids, power systems protection, modelling, simulation and design are addressed alongside economics, supply chain and market factors.

The course has been developed for graduates with electrical/electronic or related engineering or scientific backgrounds to meet the increasing demand from the energy and power industry.



Career opportunities

Students are prepared for careers that encompass a range of roles in the power industry, from technical aspects to management roles. Graduates have found jobs as engineers, managers and analysts in the power sector with companies such as Ofgem, National Grid, UK Power Networks, E.ON, EDF Energy, Vattenfall, Caterpillar and the transport sector.

Robotics, Al and Autonomous SystemsMSc



Duration

Full-time: one year Part-time: two years and four months

This course is designed to develop successful engineering specialists in the emerging industry of robotics, AI and autonomous systems. It is suited for graduates and professionals who want to cultivate skills to face the challenges of this desirable market.

The course adopts robotics and AI as instruments for the design and deployment of autonomous systems. Students gain in-depth knowledge of recent advances in relevant domains: robotics, machine learning and imaging, human-machine/machine-machine teaming, communications, embedded systems and control. They also explore the regulations framework of autonomous systems, and the ethical issues arising from their utilisation.

The course organisers work closely with industry and prestigious research institutions to offer students relevant lectures/guest seminars, tutorials, laboratory coursework, design projects and industry/research-oriented dissertations.



Career opportunities

Graduates in Robotics, Al and Autonomous Systems are sought for employment opportunities in several branches of industry including automotive/transportation, robotics, aerospace, defence, energy and manufacturing.

Skills acquired, including software and hardware robotics, AI/ML, image processing and computer vision are attractive for a wide range of wellestablished companies and SMEs linked to the autonomous systems and AI market and beyond.

Space Mission Analysis and DesignMSc



Duration

Full-time: one year Part-time: two years

City is the only university in the UK to combine space operations and space law in our Space Mission Analysis and Design MSc. It has been designed to develop the careers of both professionals and graduates, with students learning to understand how the space sector is used by commercial and government organisations.

The programme equips students with the skills to plan a space mission from its inception to completion and teaches the management of a space mission with the constraints of the law and safety regulations.

City's laboratory sessions concentrate on extensive use of immersive simulation using NASA's General Mission Analysis Tool (GMAT) and MATLAB with a Space Module to emulate real space missions to test plans and designs.



Career opportunities

The course aims to provide an introductory advanced qualification for entry into the space sector, which is growing at 10 to 20 per cent each year. With many more countries planning to enter space operations, the number of vacancies currently exceed the supply of suitably qualified applicants.

The course is also designed to offer existing employees in the sector the opportunity to enhance their careers to middle technology/management positions and beyond by gaining additional knowledge to add to experience.

For those interested in space science encompassing astrophysics and astronomy, the course will provide excellent supporting study in the enabling space technologies.

Studying made affordable

Postgraduate study at City is an affordable option for students from a wide range of backgrounds.

Although students will usually have to pay for postgraduate study themselves, many sources of funding exist including scholarships, studentships and loans. During their time at City, students can obtain financial advice and support from City's award-winning Student Centre.

Scholarships and loans

Postgraduate scholarships

City has a wide range of scholarship opportunities available for students in all six of its Schools. There are also several externally funded scholarships open to City students.

Research Council studentships

Research Councils may be able to provide financial assistance for UK, EU and overseas postgraduate students. It is best to contact the council relevant to the specific area of study directly to enquire about eligibility and application.

Charities and trusts

There may be funding for postgraduate study available from charities and trusts. The British Council has a scholarship search database that many find helpful.

Disabled Students' Allowance (DSA)

Students can apply for Disabled Students' Allowance (DSA) if they live in England and have a disability that affects their ability to study, such as a learning difficulty, a mental health condition, physical disability or a long-term health condition.

Hardship Fund

City's Hardship Fund provides discretionary financial assistance for students experiencing unexpected financial hardship to help them remain in higher education. The Fund is administered by the Student Centre and is intended to act as a safety net for those in financial difficulty.

Postgraduate loans

Postgraduate loans are available from the Government to help cover the cost of postgraduate study. Students undertaking a master's degree can apply for up to £12,167* to help pay tuition fees or living expenses. The loan is non-means tested and paid directly to the student.


If a student is interested in undertaking a research degree, they can apply for a Postgraduate Doctoral Loan for up to £28,673*, divided equally across each year of the course.

A dedicated international team

In addition to hosting regular online events, the International Student Recruitment team visits over 50 countries each year, meeting prospective students interested in studying at City. Additionally, a worldwide network of approved agent representatives is on hand to help students with their applications.

International Student Advice

Our specialist International Student Advice and Compliance team helps international students with immigration queries and concerns and supports them to settle in with a series of activities during Welcome Week, designed specifically for international students.

Visa requirements

Students are responsible for obtaining necessary visas and entry clearance into the UK and are advised to prepare in advance by researching the requirements for students from their home country. Information about applying for, and extending, visas to study is available on City's website. A team of dedicated International Student Advisers can help with the visa application process.


If students have an existing Student visa that was issued for study at another university, college or school in the UK, they will need to complete a new Student visa application with the UK Home Office using a Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS) from City before they will be allowed to register.

English language requirements and courses

As City's courses are delivered in English, students whose first language is not English will need to undertake a language test to demonstrate their English ability is sufficient to undertake degree-level study. English language requirements vary by course and are likely to be higher than the minimum English language requirements set by the Home Office for students requiring a visa. City's partner, INTO City, runs pre-sessional English courses during the summer to help students improve their English before their courses start.

Applying to City

Choosing a postgraduate course at City is the beginning of a journey towards a rewarding career.

How to apply

Applications for the majority of postgraduate courses need to be made directly to City. To apply, visit the webpage of the intended course of study and click on the 'How to apply' tab to read more about the application process, including any supporting documentation required and to access the online application system.

With a few exceptions, most postgraduate courses do not have a fixed application deadline and operate on a rolling admission basis. Applications will close when the course is full, so students are encouraged to apply as early as possible. Where a deadline is in place, further information can be found on the specific course webpage.

Entry requirements

Applicants for postgraduate study should normally hold a university honours degree in a relevant subject. However, if students do not hold an honours degree (or an equivalent qualification) but have suitable experience or professional qualifications, they may still be accepted for a master's course or a Postgraduate Diploma at the discretion of the relevant School.

Students who are in the final year of their undergraduate studies or are vet to receive their English Language test results can still apply for most postgraduate courses at City. Their applications will be assessed based on predicted grades and if all other entry criteria are met, applicants might receive a conditional offer subject to them satisfying the relevant conditional requirements.

Pre-master's courses provide a route to several of City's courses for international students that do not qualify for direct entry. Students can take a City validated course with INTO City or study with City's partner, Kaplan International College London. Courses at both providers guarantee progression to City for students that meet the required grades.

Tuition fees and living costs

Tuition fees vary by course and further information can be found on the website. Remember that tuition fees do not include the cost of accommodation and students will need to budget for this along with flights, food, travel, books and personal items. Where necessary, City's temping agency, Unitemps, can help students find suitable work.

Some courses may require a tuition fee deposit to be paid at the time of acceptance.




